
This year, we are offering a choice on the last afternoon, between visiting key industry employment precincts/ business parks or inner city housing renewal and major development harbourside precincts.


This tour is designed to provide administrators, policy makers, regulators, planners and community leaders with in-depth insight into:

The tour will provide you with an opportunity to build important connections (both local and interstate) for future reference.






Projects have been chosen to provide a crosssection of best practice project types across CBD, inner urban, suburban and fringe locations, including:

10:00am Penrith City Centre (coffee break)

Hear from Council's Program Manager and Property Development Manager for Commercial Developments regarding Council's plans to encourage new commercial floor space development on surplus council land, plans for a major town park as an investment and community focal point and explore the upgraded and reactivated 1950s/60s main street.

11:00am Thornton

Thornton is a combination of suburban, medium density and high-rise apartments close to Penrith town centre. The estate includes rear laneway development and mixed market/community/social housing in high rise apartments. The community is focused around a central recreation space, waterbodies and the Penrith Railway Station.

12:30am Oran Park Town Centre (lunch break)

Oran Park Town Centre is a mixed-use retail, commercial, residential, community and recreation precinct at the heart of a large greenfield suburban growth precinct which has grown enormously over the last few years. Hear from the developers of this centre as to how they have funded its development, encouraged investment and delivered outcomes for the community.

2:30pm Greenfields Development Tour - Harrington Grove/ The Hermitage/ Gledswood Hills

This tour will provide opportunities to view the most prestigious land development projects in South West Sydney and will highlight park and community facility development, the impact of residential design guidelines, the value of extensive tree planting, responding to sloping sites, and different land tenure arrangements.

3:45pm Ed. Square

Ed Square is a new shopping and entertainment precinct in a greenfield location, adjacent to Edmondson Park Railway Station. The precinct has quickly established a vibrant pedestrian 'eat street' and includes some innovative medium density housing designs and shareway street environments.

8:30am Depart Bondi Junction

A spectacular ferry ride from Circular Quay under the 'Bridge' to Barangaroo and then past numerous waterfront development sites takes us to Wentworth Point.

10:00am Wentworth Point (coffee break)

Wentworth point is a new community located on a peninsula surrounded by the harbour and bushland. It is accessed via ferry, a bus/cycle/pedestrian bridge and a bushland cycleway and provides high density apartment living and a commercial centre. The precinct includes attractive high spec urban environments that cater for the population density.

11:30am Putney Hill

Putney Hill is an infill residential project which provides detached housing, townhouses and apartment living together with a medical rehabilitation centre, lake reserve and comprehensive recreation and community facilities which include a community garden.

1:00am Marrickville Library (lunch break)

Visit Marrickville Library, a community space that was shortlisted for the best library in the world in 2021 and saw visitation double since its opening in late 2019. The design adaptively reuses several heritage buildings and provides a major meeting place through its internal spaces and external café. See the adjacent apartment development which integrates with the site.

3:00pm Green Square Library & Gunyama Park Aquatic & Recreation Centre

Green Square Library is unique, from its underground location to its inclusion of a cocktail bar for drinks at the end of a hard day studying in the library. The setting is in a large plaza providing space for the surrounding apartment dwellers. Gunyama Park Aquatic and Recreation Centre is the largest investment of its type since the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games. It includes a 50-metre training/events pool, a large recreational pool, a gymnasium, an artificial turf soccer pitch and a range of other facilities.

9:00am Newmarket Redevelopment

This estate has involved the redevelopment of a horse stabling area, formerly associated with the Randwick Racecourse and comprises a central plaza, heritage structures, parks and apartments. It was delivered via a spot rezoning.



11:00am Flour Mill Redevelopment, Summer Hill (lunch)

A comprehensive redevelopment of former commercial and industrial land holdings at the confluence of the heavy rail and light rail systems has resulted in the transformation of the Dulwich Hill/Summer Hill area. At the core of the redevelopment is a complex of heritage listed flour mill buildings that have been repurposed for apartment and community use. The surrounding area is of particular interest as derelict commercial properties are redeveloped on a site by site basis.

12:45pm Arrive at Redfern



There is a choice this afternoon to either continue with the regular tour to the Pemulwuy Project and Barangaroo to Circular Quay Walking Tour or alternatively, go on the Industry, Employment and Business Park Tour, which will travel to Australian Technology Park on foot and then be picked up by car/mini-van to continue to Greystanes and Norwest.

1:00pm Pemulwuy Project, Redfern
This Aboriginal Housing Company project on land known as 'The Block', has been delivered adjacent to Redfern
Railway Station and includes low cost, low rise social

housing for 62 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families, as well as high rise student accommodation, a childcare centre, a gymnasium and a gallery.



2:00pm Barangaroo to Circular Quay Walking Tour

This rapidly changing environment includes major commercial buildings, extensive hospitality, food and beverage venues, some of the most expensive residential apartments in Australia and the iconic Crown Tower. The walk includes Barangaroo Point Park, scenic views of the Harbour Bridge, Opera House and Circular Quay and concludes at the revamped Loftus Lane, where old and new built forms coexist in harmony.

Option B - Industry, Employment & Business Park Tour WED 26 OCT 2022

1:00pm Australian Technology Park

The Park is located within the old Eveleigh Railway Yards and has repurposed the Engine Workshop for a range of retail and conference uses. The Park itself includes a range of technology-based businesses and has recently delivered "The Foundry", a 66,000m2 low rise office building that is a "city within a building", providing discrete floorspace pods inside an outer façade.


2:30pm Greystanes Quarry Industrial Park


One of Sydney's premier industrial estates, located in a historic quarry site, the development incorporates a number of water and energy efficient features across 340,000m2 of floorspace. The location takes advantage of its proximity to the M4 and M7 Motorways to provide space for logistics, warehousing, manufacturing and research uses.

4:00pm Norwest Business Park

Norwest is one of the first genuine business parks in Australia, having commenced more than 20 years ago and originally catering largely for light industry but having evolved to provide a suburban office function, a medical precinct, including a large private hospital, a town centre and premium residential areas to service the white-collar workforce.

The cost of the tour is \$1,995 plus GST for the land content.
